Fostering Filial Piety

The Tin Ka Ping Teaching and Research Centre for Filial Piety embodies the mission to promote moral education, disseminate Chinese culture, integrate world civilizations, and enhance the quality of Chinese education. The center is dedicated to researching and promoting filial piety culture with objectives that include promoting the spirit and concept of filial piety, conducting related academic research, advocating for the social practice of filial virtues, and popularizing knowledge of filial piety. The center's logo, inspired by ancient Oracle bone script, symbolizes familial bonds, generational succession, and respect between the young and the elderly, vividly embodying the essence of filial piety.

The center's primary focus is academic research. Its findings and a comprehensive database on filial piety culture are applied in universities, primary and secondary schools, and elder learning centers. The aim of this effort is to popularize and promote the cultural value of filial piety. The center has published a bibliography on filial piety culture, covering documents and research from ancient to modern times. Currently, the center is editing a specialized book on filial piety from an interdisciplinary perspective to explore its modern significance and universal value. This book is expected to inspire scholars to pursue new research directions. The center is also compiling a collection titled "Filial Piety in Chinese and Foreign Stories and Literature," which will be published on its website to inspire modern society with historical stories and literary works. It holds several academic seminars annually to engage the public and students. Additionally, the center conducts school visits to deliver lectures on filial piety.



The center actively organizes activities to promote filial piety and Chinese culture among primary and secondary students. Activities held in 2024 include lectures and virtual reality events that combine traditional culture with modern technology. Events such as the "Same Root, Same Origin—Guangdong-Hong Kong Cultural Exchange" and workshops at the Yulan Festival highlight the center's commitment to cultural exchange and education. An international academic symposium on filial piety culture and a China-Korea exchange seminar further emphasize the center's role in fostering mutual understanding and promoting the cultural significance of filial piety.

Through these initiatives, the Tin Ka Ping Teaching and Research Centre for Filial Piety aims to make a profound social impact by fostering a deeper appreciation of filial piety and its relevance in contemporary society. Thus, it aims to contribute to the moral and cultural development of future generations.
